

Lenten Abstinence

1. Everyone over 7 years of age is bound to observe the law of abstinence.
2. Complete abstinence is to be observed on Fridays, Ash Wednesday, and Holy Saturday. On days of complete abstinence, meat and soup or gravy made from meat may not be used at all.
3. Partial abstinence is to be observed on Ember Wednesday (Feb 21) and Saturday (Feb 24). On days of partial abstinence, meat and soup or gravy made from meat may be taken only once a day at the principal meal.

Lenten Fast

1. Everyone 21 - 59 years of age is bound to observe the law of fast.
2. All the days in Lent except Sundays are days of fast.
3. On days of fast, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal.
4. Meat may be taken at the principal meal except on Fridays, Ash Wednesday, and Holy Saturday.
5. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices, are allowed.
6. Where health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In doubt concerning fast or abstinence, a parish priest or confessor should be consulted.

or tongues shall cease, or knowledge shall be destroyed.

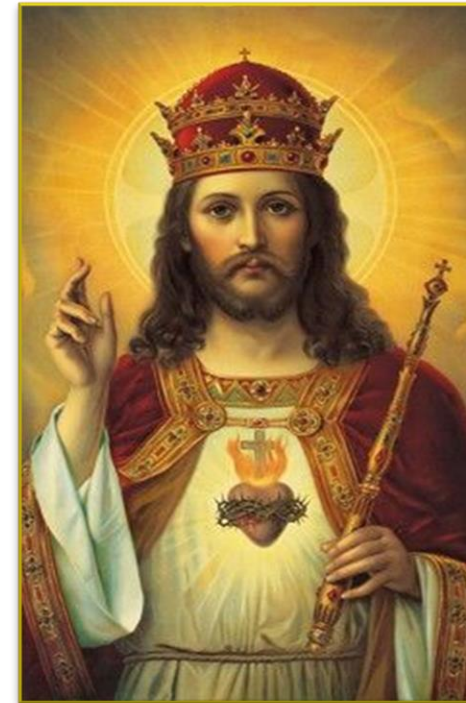

On Saturday we commemorate the second of Mary’s Sorrows, the Flight into Egypt.

“He is set for a sign which shall be contradicted.” Scarcely is Jesus born, when He is persecuted to death. What suffering it must have been to the heart of Mary to hear the tidings of that cruel exile!

Flee from thy friends to strangers, from the holy temple of the only true God to the temples of demons. What greater tribulation than that a new-born child, clinging to its mother’s bosom, should be forced to fly! Every one can imagine how much Mary must have suffered on this journey.

It was a long distance to Egypt; a journey of at least thirty days. The way was rough, unknown, through woods, and little frequented. The season was winter; they had to travel in snow, rain, wind, and storms, through bad and difficult roads. Mary was fifteen years of age, a delicate virgin. Oh God, how piteous a spectacle to see that tender Virgin, with that newly born Infant in her arms, wandering through this world! Where did they obtain food? Where did they rest at night? How were they lodged? What food could they have, other than a piece of hard bread which Joseph brought with him or begged in charity? Where could they have slept (particularly in the two hundred miles of desert through which they travelled, with neither houses nor inns) except on the sand, or under some tree in the wood, in the open air, exposed to robbers or those wild beasts with which Egypt abounded? Ah, if any one had met these three greatest Personages of the world, what would he have believed them to be but three poor, roving beggars?
